espite electronics being only one of several areas that Gold Note focuses on, the multi-talented audio manufacturer makes some extremely sophisticated products. Case in point: the HP-10 Deluxe.

On the face of it, this is a fairly conventional headphone amplifier with balanced and unbalanced analogue inputs and outputs (albeit one that, in this premium 'Deluxe' form, also adds Bluetooth functionality and a USB-C input). But power this beautiful half-width beast up, and you will soon realise that a text display has been included for good reason.

A tweaker's dream

Indeed, the HP-10 Deluxe offers a complete suite of 'Studio' adjustments - crossfeed settings, Harman curve equalisation options, damping factor and (response linearising) 'Superflat' modes, and even the ability to assemble profiles for different headphones or genres. It's a tweaker's dream

(yes, a remote is thankfully included!) and proves valuable for Ed Selley, who is a big fan of the crossfeed function: "When Hope Sandoval begins her stunning vocal turn in Into Dust, she's in front of you and not simply singing into each ear."

Such praise applies broadly to the Gold Note's music-making, too. "The most immediately arresting aspect of what it does is the sheer amount of detail it effortlessly extracts from material," he notes as he plays Agnes Obel's 'Philharmonics'. "The HP-10 demonstrates excellent tonal realism coupled with enough dynamics to ensure that a real sense of the constrained force in her piano is conveyed in the recording. This is aided by excellent bass extension."

Any suspicions that Gold Note could be a jack of all trades and master of none are resolutely put to bed by the HP-10 Deluxe.
